## EMERGENCY!

**PREPARATION:** Maintain a **list of important phone numbers** and place in a prominent location. **Call 911** first if there are injuries or immediate life-threatening hazards. Bolsa Chica Emergency Coordinators will check on you to see if you're ok. Get to know them if you can. The Bolsa Chica Emergency Preparedness & Evacuation Plan has information that may save your life or your home. It's interesting too!

**Secure heavy items** on shelves that could become projectiles during an earthquake. Have tall, **heavy furniture bolted to the walls**.

Know where your **utility shut-off valves** are and keep a **wrench** close to the valves.

Maintain enough emergency **water and food supply** to last at **least four days**, and keep **flashlights** near your bedside and in easily accessible places in the house.

Maintain **smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, first-aid kits, and a battery radio**.

Make a **list of all medications** with their dosages and your **doctor's name**. Make it readily available so you can give it to a first responder.

**EARTHQUAKE!** **During an Earthquake:**  
If you are indoors, **stay there**. If you can, **duck or drop to the floor, take cover** under a sturdy desk or table, and **hold** onto it so that it doesn't move away from you. If you can't drop down, protect your head and wait until the shaking stops. **Do not rush outside. Don't try to run to a doorway.**  
If you are outside, move away from buildings and power lines. Stay in the open. If you are in a moving car, stop as soon as it is safe. Remain in the car.

**After an Earthquake:**  
Check the **people near you for injuries**.  
Inspect the utilities for damage to **water, gas, and electrical lines**. If damage or leaks are detected, **turn off the utility** at your outdoor **shut-off valve**.  
**Extinguish open flames if it is safe to do so.**  
Do not use the telephone except to report an emergency (**call 911**).  
**Turn on battery-powered radio** for emergency information.  
**Stay away from damaged structures;** aftershocks can cause their collapse.  
Stay away from beaches and waterfront areas subject to tsunamis.

**FIRE!** If home is on fire, and if it is safe to do so, use fire extinguishers to put out the fire. If fire is out of control, **evacuate your house and call 911**. Alert your neighbors.  
**If fire is out of control, shut off outside gas shut-off valve if it is safe to do so.**

**BAD WEATHER!** Heavy rainfall and/or strong wind carry the risks of power and communications outages and floods. Stay inside or evacuate if ordered to do so.
